The Deputy Town Clerk advised members that Stockton-on-Tees Food Power Network (SFPN) is looking for expressions of interest in developing a community pantry.

The SFPN aim to strengthen the current provision of community/eco shops which have already identified a need in supporting local communities to access affordable food.

SFPN will actively work with providers to enable them to develop their provision with funding from Stockton on Tees Borough Council, support to include Fairshare subscription, set up costs, signage, environmental health advice, training, funding to support sustainability, promotion, and marketing. The SFPN electric van can assist with the collection of surplus food from venues for transport and distribution to community pantries.

A Community Food Support Directory resource for the VCSE sector to access other organisations who provide crisis food support, specific food support, eco shops/community pantries is accessible via Catalyst website. The Town Council's Sunday Lunch service for older residents is listed in the directory.
