What is green hydrogen?

Green hydrogen is made by using renewable and low carbon power sources, such as solar or wind, to split water (H₂O) into hydrogen (H₂) and oxygen (O₂) in a process called water electrolysis. It has a number of potential uses, including as a low carbon fuel source and feedstock for the chemical and petrochemical industries. It can also be used for power generation and as an alternative fuel source for mobility and transport.

Developing low carbon energy in Teesside

Teesside has a long and proud history of industrial activity, ranging from steelmaking to chemicals. The region continues to play a key role in UK industry today, with Teesside's leading industrial businesses making a significant economic contribution both locally and across the whole of UK each year.

The UK government has made a legally binding commitment to achieve net zero in greenhouse gas emissions by 2050. Key to achieving this will be ensuring carbon intensive sectors in areas like Teesside, are able to decarbonise. The industrial sector in Teesside is concentrated in a tightly packed area, making it a great location to decarbonise effectively and efficiently.


HyGreen Teesside, alongside other proposed projects in the local area, can help Teesside become the UK's leading hydrogen hub, creating new high-quality jobs, supporting local education and skills development, and kick-starting a highly skilled UK-based hydrogen supply chain.

Benefits for the local community

As well as contributing to local economic development, the quality of jobs and upskilling opportunities provided by HyGreen Teesside will support local people.

Our planned blue hydrogen facility

Alongside HyGreen Teesside, we are proposing a large-scale blue hydrogen production facility also in the Teesside area. This blue hydrogen project could also support the UK's decarbonisation aims by producing over 10% of the UK's low-carbon hydrogen target by 2030.

Blue hydrogen, also referred to as Carbon Capture and Storage-enabled low carbon hydrogen, is extracted from natural gas. H2Teesside will convert methane (CH₄) in natural gas into hydrogen (H₂) and carbon dioxide (CO₂).

The vast majority of CO₂ produced during this process is captured and stored permanently, preventing it from entering the atmosphere. H2Teesside will capture approximately 2 million tonnes of CO₂ per year, equivalent to capturing the emissions from the heating of one million UK households.

When can I hear more about H2Teesside?

The H2Teesside project is separate to HyGreen Teesside, and requires a different type of granted in the form of a Development Consent Order.

We're still developing our plans for H2Teesside and will shortly consult with the local community. We'll write to you about our plans and invite you to share your views with us.

Appendix B

Adult Fitness initiatives within the Borough

Tees Active - Funded Health initiatives

Tees Active are working together with Stockton on Tees Borough Council (SBC) to improve the health and wellbeing of residents offering weight management programmes.

Life 4 Life weight management – GP referral or open to self-referral for any resident living in Stockton.

Life 4 Life initiative is a group weight management programme that educates, supports and promotes sustainable life changes to prevent long term complications, which can arise from being overweight.

The course includes twelve weekly one hour sessions giving advice and education on positive lifestyle changes. The course includes ten weeks unlimited access to Activ8's four gyms, fitness classes (low intensity classes available) & four swimming pools.

Energise by Activ8 Health & Fitness

Free 12 week programme by Activ8 Health & Fitness funded by SBC to help make positive changes to lifestyle through eating healthy and exercising. The course includes twelve weekly 1 hour sessions (30 minutes of advice and 30 minutes of exercise). Ten weeks unlimited access to Activ8's four gyms, fitness classes (low intensity classes available) & four swimming pools.

Active Health

Twelve week physical activity programme for adults who have one or more health conditions that are a barrier for them to becoming active. Participants on the scheme are referred by medical professionals who assess that physical activity may be helpful.

The scheme is designed to help participants manage and improve their conditions, along with their overall health and well-being, through increased physical activity levels, and sustainable behaviour changes.

Physical activity recommendations from trained GP Referral staff. Tailored workout programmers built for each individual. Options to access gym/swimming/group based classes that are appropriate for patients with a wide range of health conditions.

Care Home Legends

The Care Home Legends pilot was a product of a meeting between Tees Active, Stockton Council's Transformation Manager and the Physical Activity Care Co-ordinator based at Stockton Care homes. The idea of a multi-physical activity event with different care homes brining teams made up of their residents was discussed and a decision was made to deliver a pilot to gain feedback.

Six care homes formed teams to participate at the event held on 2nd December 2022 which included residents from Hadrian Park Care Home in Billingham.

Participants started the day with a Funky4life warm up and were joined by the children and staff from Treetops nursery.

Participants and care home staff took part in events that included Balloon Keepy Up, Curling, Golf putting, Magnetic darts, Table Tennis, Archery, Netball Penalty shootout.

Year 11 pupils from St Michaels RC Academy acted as volunteers to assist in the smooth running of the event.

Tees Active marketing department live streamed the event via video to the care homes that were competing so their fellow residents could watch the action and support their teams. Streaming via a private link to You Tube for relations of residents.

Plans are in progress to stage a larger event (s) looking at ice skating session to discover the practicalities of enabling wheelchair users to 'skate on ice.' Residents from Hadrian's Park Care Home were invited to attend the NE Opens Figure Skating championships as VIP guests and were interviewed on Radio BBC Tees.

- Love exploring app app is available on smart phone or tablet and allows you to
 play reality games and trails at parks across the Borough.
- Wynyard Woodland Park Run 5km, developing café, bike reclamation scheme and workshops such as woodcrafts and willow weaving.

- Park Play (Sport England) Pilot Scheme looking at Play Leaders in parks on Saturday mornings between the hours of 10am-12 noon engaging families to play sports i.e., rounders, football.
- Kit out the Borough Scheme donation bins located in leisure centres across the Borough. Donate unused sports clothing and shoes for disadvantaged families across the area to ensure children do not miss out on the opportunity to participate in sport.
- Bede Sixth Form College Sports Centre working with students at Bede Sports Centre who are volunteering to facilitate sport activities at Port Clarence.

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
