Café in the Park

The café has seen an increase in footfall since the May half term holidays. New customers are providing positive feedback. Groups of people are using the café as a meeting point. The café is selling ice creams, slushes and milkshakes.

Pantry in The Park

The pantry is continuing to go well on a weekly basis approximately forty people visit the pantry to access food. Billingham Environmental Link Programme (BELP) have donated fresh fruit and vegetables from their health and wellbeing garden.

Soup & Sandwich project

The Billingham Community Project are providing homemade soup. Vouchers are handed out at the food pantry on a Monday with an option to eat in or takeaway.

Sunday Lunch Service

Approximately eighty eight meals are delivered every Sunday. It is becoming increasingly difficult to source volunteer drivers to deliver the lunches.

Report to Services & Engagement Committee 18th July 2023 Report by: Miss Tracy Reece, Business Support Manager Café in The Park

- The café has seen an increase in footfall and is exceptional busy.
- Selling ice creams, slushes, and milkshakes.

Pantry in the Park

- Service operates every Monday between the hours of 10.00am 12.30pm.
- We continue to see an increase in demand for the service.
- Fresh fruit and vegetables have been donated from Billingham Environmental Link
 Programme's health and wellbeing garden.

Soup & Sandwich Project

- Billingham Community Project prepare fresh homemade soup each week.
- Vouchers are handed out at the pantry with an option to eat in or takeaway.
- · We have seen an increase in people accessing the service.

Sunday Lunch Service

- During June we delivered 88 two course dinners to local residents. The service is currently under review.
- We continue to struggle to recruit new volunteer drivers and continue to be listed on the Stockton Volunteers website.

Stockton Borough Council's Environmental Health service have recently completed a food hygiene inspection and we have received a 5-star food hygiene rating for all services.
